

The earlier than normal breakup of sea ice in many parts of the Canadian Arctic, reported to you last week, has continued, and 2019 is shaping up to be a record low year for sea ice. As breakup continues, the remaining ice will become more mobile, driven mainly by the wind.

This could pose some challenges for us in local areas like Larsen Sound, but we remain optimistic that our ships, MS Fram and MS Roald Amundsen, will be able to navigate the Northwest Passage this year. We are as excited as you are to be starting our voyages later this month!
